It was the Veteran, not the lawyer, who has given us the right to fair trial.

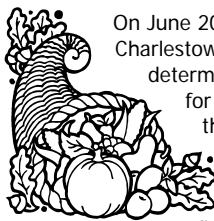
It was the Veteran, not the campus organizer, who has given us freedom to demonstrate.
